GEAR UP Maine works in collaboration with 63 schools in 26 districts and a wide range of college access partners to serve more than 9,000 students from Northern, Central, Western, and Downeast Maine. GEAR UP Maine is funded by the US Department of Education, Office of Postsecondary Education until 2021. The grant was awarded to The University of Maine at Farmington (UMF) in September 2014. UMF serves as the award’s fiscal agent, while Syntiro, a non-profit based in Readfield, provides the administration.
